Free Fishing and Park Entry Day is held annually in Nebraska's State Parks. It means anyone can fish without a permit or visit a state park area without a park entry permit that day only. Even though fishing and park entry permits are not required, anglers must observe all fishing regulations. The Bill Morris Memorial Fishing Derby also is a great opportunity to participate in the Take 'em Fishing challenge, in which anglers pledge to take new or inexperienced anglers fishing.

Tournament Rules:

- Tournament fishing will occur on Saturday, May 20, 2022 starting at 8:00am
- Individual entries only. Age groups: 6 & under, 7-12, 13 & older.
- The Ponca State Park pond is catch and release only; except for trout. Daily trout limit is 5. •
- Anglers must take a picture of their fish appropriately placed on the tape measure provided by Ponca State Park. Pick up at the Resource & Education Center between 8:00am-5:00pm on Saturday, May 20.
- All submissions must be emailed before 10:00pm on Saturday, May 20 to katie.leware@nebraska.gov. Include your full name, age, hometown, fish species, length, and picture.
- Results will be posted on the Ponca State Park's Facebook page (Ponca State Park NE) on Monday, May • 22rd.
- Tournament winners will be notified via email.




